PEER RESPONSE: DRAFT SELF-ASSESSMENT

Context: Today you will do peer response with a partner. The following self-assessment of your paper (on lab 4) has the purpose of preparing you for the peer response.

Please work first on steps 1. - 3.; then get together in pairs as listed in 4.

1. Main Result:

Write one single sentence summarizing your paper; i.e. write a one-sentence abstract.

2. Outline/Structure:

Map out or plot the organization of your paper. You can do this by naming sections, annotating major paragraphs, underlining transitions, writing a keyword outline, and/or sketching something like a flow-chart. This outline should be an outline of the main content, so more than "introduction, experiment, results, conclusions." Include in your outline how you get to your one sentence result (this is the support of your main statement) and also indicate where in your paper you state your main result.

3. Your Questions:

Which questions about your paper would you like to ask your partner to keep in mind while the two of you read through the draft? What would be most helpful for you to get feedback on.

4. Peer Response:

To ensure that you pair up with someone who has written their paper on a different topic than you, please pair up as below:
