• **Know Thy Audience:** Are you pitching your message in a way that is appropriate for who is listening?

• **Get the audience motivated:** What do they stand to gain by listening to you?

• Establish a context: How will you introduce the topic so that the audience can follow you?

• Demonstrate your organization: How will you show the audience your plan for the talk?

• Use fact-supported arguments: Why is your talk credible? where did you get your materials?

 Bring it all together in the end: How can you leave your audience feeling smarter for listening to your talk?

• The language you use: Do you use clear, vivid, imaginative language? Are you coming across as fair and unprejudiced?

• The way your work with your voice: Can you be heard anywhere in the room? Are you whispering or shouting? Do you "punctuate" your speech with fillers? Do you enunciate clearly? Do you have a good pace?

• The way your work with your body: Do you convey energy without seeming spastic? Does your posture convey self-confidence? Do you make eye contact? Do you use gestures and facial expressions to your advantage?

• The visual aids you use: Do they help, distract, or overwhelm? Do they support your point effectively? Is your design up-to-date? Does your palette energize or depress the senses?
