To allow us more time for the reading of Cat's Cradle and to catch up on the comparison of our identified stereotypes with the reading of "From Faust to Dr. Strangelove", we will adjust the syllabus. On Sept. 6 we will discuss stereotypes by putting together and comparing all information of all previous classes and assignments (the fun part of research :-).
