Goal:

convey ideas and concepts

→ be clear

→ get your audience interested

Preparation:

- ▶ know subject (content same as first paper)
- ▶ slides (see more below)
- ▶ demo (only if possible)
- ▶ practice (aloud, alone & for friend, time yourself)

Goal:

convey ideas and concepts

→ be clear

→ get your audience interested

Oral Presentation:

- ▶ volume
- ▶ right pace
- ▶ conversational style (do not just read, but use scientific jargon
→ difficult → practice)
- ▶ vary intonation, stresses and pacing

Non-Verbal (Body):

- ▶ use pointer
- ▶ eye contact
- ▶ facial expressions, gestures
- ▶ posture, breathing

Goal:

convey ideas and concepts

→ be clear

→ get your audience interested

- ▶ main point?
