

## Minutes of the Faculty Meeting <br> September 8, 2003

The meeting was called to order at 5PM by Prof. Michael Payne. Prof. Payne reminded the faculty of the upcoming forum on the presidential search as well as a dinner hosted by the Trustees.

## Announcements by the President

The President welcomed old and new faculty and introduced David Surgala, the new VicePresident for Finance and Administration. In response to several questions about staff salaries, he reported that our benchmark for salaries, the Consumer Price Index, was $2.13 \%$ last year. The average salary increase for faculty, as well as administrative and support staff was $2.5 \%$, including the President's staff. A very small number of faculty received less than CPI. He also reported that the 3:2 teaching load was not currently being discussed.

This year we will complete the Middle States Accreditation Review, the performance classification study, and will work on the budgets through 2005. Our projected deficit has been reduced due to a better stock market, from 3 to 2.1 million. But health care costs remain a concern. The Board of Trustees has capped any increase on health care costs in ' 05 .

Prof. Matt Silberman asked if the administration planned to get the Personnel Committee involved in the health care cost situation. VP Surgala said that over the summer a task force was created to study this problem, consisting of representatives from the two Personnel Committees, Planning and Budget, and the personnel department, as well as some other administrators. Data from an upcoming peer group study will be helpful. Prof. Silberman was concerned that the issue will not go through the proper governance bodies and thence to the faculty. President Rogers assured him that any proposals will be brought through the proper procedures and involve the community.

Introductions of new faculty and librarians were given by Deans Gerdes and Orbison, and ISR Director Gene Spencer (see attached list).

Announcements by the Chair of the Faculty
Prof. Payne noted that he had sent out a mailing advising the faculty of its rights and responsibilities in the governance system, including the right of either a committee or an individual to bring motions to the floor as long as they adhere to the three-day rule. He is also happy to answer questions about procedures at any time. He will enforce a 15 min limit on discussion of any questions sent to the President.

This year, we face several complex issues. The head of the Middle States team will be on campus October 28. The Faculty Council is part of the Steering Committee for the Middle States
review. We also have a presidential search process. The Faculty Advisory Committee's role is to receive any nominations from faculty, and is the faculty group available to interview candidates at the discretion of the main search committee. We are following the Association of Governing Boards procedures, under which candidates' names are kept confidential in early stages of the search. Additional nominations were solicited for this committee, but none were forthcoming.

Prof. Marty Ligare offered the following resolution about some recent good news: The faculty recognizes and applauds the commitment of the Athletic Department to the academic success of Bucknell students as manifested in the recently announced $100 \%$ graduation rate of Bucknell student-athletes. This was seconded and accepted unanimously.

## Old Business

Prof. Allen Schweinsburg re-introduced the matter of updating the Faculty Handbook, first introduced last March. He pointed out that the last printed version from 1992, by now a collector's item, is wrong in many places. Some errors result from changes that the faculty voted on. But most of the updating is simply information that changes over 11 years. The Personnel Committed was guided by the Staff Handbook that is changed every 2 years; for instance, faculty and staff benefits are nearly the same. The document is posted on ERES. The Comparisons and Commentary section shows all the proposed changes; over the summer, a few additional changes were made and they show up in green font. CAFT has also reviewed the Handbook and may have some amendments to offer. He invited everyone to look over the document for discussion and vote in October.

Prof. Payne thanked Prof. Schweinsburg and his committee for all its hard work on the Handbook. Prof. Ben Marsh asked about future changes. Prof. Schweinsburg admitted he had a collection of substantive amendments that have been suggested, which will go through the Personnel Committee for possible faculty action in the future, after the Handbook has been updated. Prof. Payne offered the ironic comment that procedures for amending the Handbook are contained in that very document.

The meeting adjourned at 6:05.
